Commissary in Pittsburgh (Moon) Gets Final Go-Ahead to Start Construction Fall 2013

There have been talks about the \$17 million facility for several years, which has the bipartisan support of the entire state Congressional delegation, but the final approval it needed was being held up by the Senate Armed Services Committee. The Pentagon leaped the committee in a letter issued by deputy undersecretary of defense Jo Ann Rooney, which basically said the necessary funding approval was in place to get the project started.

"Since Congress appropriated funds for construction of the commissary, I have determined that additional Congressional approval is not required for construction to proceed," the principal deputy undersecretary for personnel and readiness wrote Dec. 1.

The Defense Commissary Agency could issue requests for proposals on the construction in the next 45 days. After bid reviews, construction of the 43,000-square-foot facility at University Boulevard and Business Loop Interstate 376 could begin next fall.

The new commissary for 168,000 eligible military personnel and veterans in the area—is supposed to replace the Charles E. Kelly Support Facility in Collier. Federal officials announced in 2005 that Kelly would close as part of a national restructuring of bases.

Editor's Note: On February 3rd, the Air Force announced plans to close the 911th Airlift Wing in Pittsburgh within the next two years, moving two of its seven C-130 transport planes to other bases and retiring the rest.
